Surveillance and Monitoring in Corporate Canada

In the 1990's when I was performing vulnerability assessments and security penetrations against corporations, one of my parameters were to test the security of the staff. Many organizations stated, "That's OK. We trust our employees". Not any more. Today, corporations must take measures to protect the confidentiality, availability, and integrity of the data that comprises the corporation and their shareholders from both internal and external threats.

This presentation covers some of the techniques and tools that I use to assist companies in determining what exactly is happening on their networks. I summarize some of the tactics that corporations can use to eliminate/mitigate the threat.
